## WHAT NOT TO INCLUDE

### ORGANIC



Food scraps, coffee grounds, fruit and vegetable peels, eggshells, tea leaves, fish and meat scraps, shells, bones, pet waste, bread, pasta, pastries, expired flour, small amounts of used flowers, nutshells, coffee pods, small amounts of soot and sawdust, small paper and tissue scraps, sugar packets, paper and cardboard soiled with food, generally anything that is biodegradable.

Biodegradable diapers and absorbent pads, even if they are bagged, plastic and containers soiled with organic waste or any other material that is not organic in nature.

### GLASS



Glass bottles, jars, glass containers, drinking glasses, flasks.

Light bulbs and neon lamps, window panes, ceramics, containers for paints and solvents, aerosol spray cans containing dangerous materials.

### PLASTICS & METALS



Plastic water and beverage bottles, shampoo bottles, detergents, containers and cups made of PVC, PET, PS, yogurt pots, bottle caps, canisters, plastic bags, film and plastic wrap, food packaging in plastic, bottle caps, plastic lids, metal cans, metal lids, aluminum foil, metal bottle caps, tin cans (e.g., tuna can).

Plastic furniture (chairs, tables, etc.), hard plastic (toys, household items), electrical and electronic appliances.

### DRY RESIDUAL



Rubber items, adhesive tape, pens, markers, non-recyclable absorbent pads, broken crockery, terracotta, porcelain, CDs, DVDs, VHS tapes, used cosmetics and tubes, diapers, sanitary towels, wax paper, used oil filters, carbon paper, pencils, cigarette filters, cotton swabs, chewing gum, expired medicines, unusable clothes, stockings, feathers... in short, everything that can't be recycled.

Electrical and electronic appliances, energy-saving and neon light bulbs, even if they are broken.

### PAPER & CARDBOARD



Notebooks, paper sheets, photocopies, newspapers, magazines (remove plastic covers), egg cartons, pasta and rice boxes, old books, outdated diaries, any type of paper or cardboard packaging, medicine boxes, Tetra Pak, daily newspapers.

All cellulose materials, hazardous containers, carbon paper, laminated paper, broken tissues and napkins, other used items.
